THAMES WATER COMPLETES FLOOD RELIEF SCHEME IN BRACKNELL

Thames Water engineers have completed work on a scheme to protect 13 properties in Bracknell from sewer floods.

Homes and gardens in Nutley have in the past been flooded with rainwater when storms have overwhelmed surface water sewers in the area.

The £375,000 project involved work to replace local rainwater sewers with larger pipes, and the construction of an underground storage tank to increase the capacity of the sewer network.

Bob Turner, Thames Water's project manager, said: "The improvements we've completed greatly reduce the risk of storms causing sewer floods at properties in the area."

Work on the scheme started last summer and was completed at the end of October.

The project is one of a series that will greatly reduce the threat of flooding to 2,000 properties across Thames Water's region by 2005.

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
